Buckinghamshire Art Society was founded in 1920. It plays an active role in the visual arts in Buckinghamshire, organising exhibitions, demonstrations, workshops and various social events, the majority of which are open to the public. The Society maintains close links with the County Museum in Aylesbury. We also maintain a website with information about our exhibitions and other activities, as well as information about each member and photos of their work.

The objective of Buckinghamshire Art Society is the encouragement and promotion of painting, drawing, printmaking, sculpture and 3D work, along with the encouragement of other art-related activities within the County of Buckinghamshire. To achieve this the Society shall strive to present and represent the best of art in Buckinghamshire. All work submitted to BAS open exhibitions is subject to selection by a Selection Panel to ensure the highest possible standard.

BAS currently has around 100 members, a large proportion of whom are professional and semi-professional artists. Representing a wide variety of styles and media, all members have been elected to the Society on the basis of their skill as artists.

The 'Young Artists Award' for 16 – 18 year olds was instituted by BAS in 2006 in order to encourage artistic activities among younger members of the public and to forge links with the art education system.
